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
ABOUT THE CENTER



WHAT DO YOU ENJOY MOST ABOUT YOUR ROLE AT GUST?

The work environment offered by GUST is ideal, and each semester brings forth a chance to interact with amazing colleagues and students. In particular, I look forward to meeting my students, who inspire me every day.

Since I enjoy creative problem-solving, I love being an educator, since it provides me with an opportunity to contribute to the University and the Kuwaiti society. My interest lies in making each assessment more engaging for students. With the help of practical projects, I facilitate real-life application of the students' skills.

As an Associate Dean of College of Business Administration, I liaise with faculty to enhance processes. We work in tandem to strive for excellence, and formulate curriculum that is engaging and relevant.

I just love the learning- I learn from staff, faculty and students. I wouldn't trade this job for anything!

HOW HAS THE COVID-19 ERA CHANGED YOUR TEACHING APPROACH?

Although online teaching is stressful and challenging, I have learnt a great deal. Before every class I found myself asking "What do students want?" "How can I keep them engaged?" "Are my students in the right state of mind to absorb new information?" Eventually, I realized that online lectures, like regular classrooms, can still facilitate discussions, debates, and creativity!

In regular classes, I would employ several techniques in my lectures. However, this period has encouraged me to leverage previously unused technology as a part of my lectures. I always seek innovative ways to engage my students to make my lectures more enjoyable. This situation forced me to re-evaluate my teaching strategies. I spent days and weeks learning from others, researching new materials, talking to colleagues, getting inspired, and applying new techniques.

SHARE YOUR EXPERIENCE WITH ONLINE TEACHING.

I've always considered myself to be an innovative and creative instructor. The rapid shift to online teaching has transformed me into my best version, both as an instructor and a human being. However, online teaching did not alter my teaching philosophy; it transformed how I deliver information and engage with my students. I have learnt a lot through this change and adapted to the situation. After returning to the campus, I will continue to employ some of the techniques I currently use!

The last 18 months entailed a steep learning curve, where we had to learn, adapt, and digest many things in a short period. There were mixed feelings though! Although online teaching is challenging, it could be very effective and efficient. This shift has forced me to be more innovative and creative while teaching and assigning projects to my students! The greatest challenge is to ensure that the expectations of my students are met in the virtual classroom.

I still believe that in-person teaching cannot be replaced, since education is also about engaging in interactions with our students to form meaningful teacher-student relationships. However, this did not prevent me from establishing meaningful relationships with my students, which is an integral part of teaching. One drawback of online teaching is the inability to read students' body language and facial expressions. Thus, we must dedicate more time into talking to students to ensure they are ok and on the right track.

ANY ADVICE YOU WOULD GIVE OUR ALUMNI?

Stay in touch with your professors; they will be glad to help you! Never offload the skills and knowledge that your educational journey imparts.

I highly encourage you to learn constantly and adopt new skills. Your dream job may not be served on a golden plate, so grab any opportunity you get to gain experience. Every experience will enhance your career prospects.

Rise to the occasion. Kuwait needs smart people like you.

She has been an Adjunct Faculty in the Finance and Economics Department. She has contributed an article to this newsletter on 'Employee Wellbeing & Productivity" that discusses the employee productivity in the workplace post-pandemic which has been a recently trending topic globally.

The world has seen a rise in unemployment post pandemic, both due to businesses downsizing or shutting down and due to an increase in resignations. Millennials and Generation Z are leading the wave, after being quarantined with endless work hours at home they now seek higher wages and greater job flexibility. Individuals have felt the urgency and lack of control that the pandemic caused encouraged everyone to seek more control in their careers while looking for work-life balance conditions.

Businesses are now looking to enhance the well-being of employees by introducing remote working options, and an environment that supports work-life balance. The pandemic has increased the trend of employers playing an expanded role in their employees' financial, physical and mental well-being. Support includes enhanced sick leave, financial assistance, adjusted hours of operation and childcare provisions. As more operations have employees working from home, some companies have also been providing a remote- work stipend. These companies include Google, Twitter, and Shopify and have provided amounts up to \$1,000. The stipend is meant to help employees recreate the office at home, and cover office expenses for things they might need to purchase and use for work in their homes. Elon Musk uses a good strategy for increasing employee productivity without pressuring them, and it is called the 85% rule. This rule is simple: When you're only doing things that are of the highest quality and contribute the most value, 85% of your time is taken care of. The other 15% is for housekeeping tasks and things that don't matter as much. This helps combat what is known as 'productivity dysmorphia' which is something many of us might have experienced and that is feeling like you accomplished nothing even after working so hard and providing output. It's a perception that stifles productivity overtime as people feel tired from all the work and do not feel the satisfaction from these accomplishments. When employees of Tesla are not pressured to overproduce and focus on quality, they have shown increased productivity as the workers become more relaxed and productive with the reduction of pressure.

The pandemic made us all more considerate of the need to live and enjoy life while we are healthy and able to and still lead a life of purpose and productivity.
